What is Sport Premium?

Sport Premium is funding allocated to schools by central government. The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age on roll at the school. Sport Premium is to be used to increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision; increasing participation in PE & Sport and enhancing the skills of teachers to deliver high quality PE lessons.

At Newton Hall Infants' School we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide a wide range of sporting opportunities for all our pupils.

2019-2020

In 2019-2020 the total Sport Premium funding for our school is **£17,190**.

Part of the money is used for:

- 1) **Investing in the Durham & Chester-Le Street School Sport Partnership (www.durhamclsssp.org.uk) Bronze Service Level Agreement** to provide the school with the following:
 - A full, organised annual programme of competitions/tournaments/festivals;
 - Access to a set amount of transport to festivals/competitions as agreed;
 - Participation, inclusion and opportunities to experience a wider range of sporting activities;

- CPD for curriculum physical education for staff;
- Bespoke menu of CPD opportunities for staff;
- SSP Network meetings to support PE Co-ordinators / PLTs in their role developing PE & sport;
- Promotion and development of links to local sports clubs;
- Access to Phase 5 Judo programme for every young person in school;
- Access to Team Durham (Durham University) assemblies;
- Central co-ordination of school sport programmes in SSP area;
- Lunchtime supervisor CPD;
- Cycle and scooter day;
- Come dance with me morning;
- Zumba kids morning;
- Full day intra-school sports event.

The cost for these services from the School Sports Partnership is **£3975**.

Further to this we intend to allocate the remaining sums of money to the following:

- ✓ Increase the range and type of sport "experience" which we offer our children by taking part in less familiar sports such as Skipping School, Hamsterley OAA, Change 4 Life club and Hula Hooping. These activities will all be delivered by specialist coaches and sometimes at specialist venues.
- ✓ To increase staff expertise in curriculum PE through a specialist PE teacher (1 session per class a week)
- ✓ To support the delivery of Real PE from an Education Development Advisor.

Impact:

The Sport Premium Funding will impact upon our school in the following ways:

- ✓ Greatly enhance the skills of our staff team (teaching and non-teaching) in terms of their ability to deliver or support in, very high quality PE sessions for our children;
 - ✓ Provide a high level of challenge in this area of the curriculum for our children;
 - ✓ Begin to develop children's physical literacy, agility, balance, and co-ordination through fundamental movement skills;
 - ✓ Raise the skill level and confidence in children to participate in PE and various sporting opportunities;
 - ✓ Increase children's knowledge of the part that PE and sport can play as part of a healthy lifestyle e.g. positive effects on behaviour, health and well-being and health and fitness;
 - ✓ Enable children to take part in a greater range of PE/sporting activity and broaden horizons as to what is possible;
 - ✓ Raise the profile of PE and Sport across the whole school community to help to make developments sustainable for the future;
 - ✓ Allow us to make links with outside Sporting providers and club links.
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- ✓ Give the pupils in our school more ownership of the type of sporting activity they take part in through training Playground Leaders in Year 2 by specialist PE teacher. This paves the way for them to become Sports Leaders or Higher Sports Leaders in future phases of their Education.
